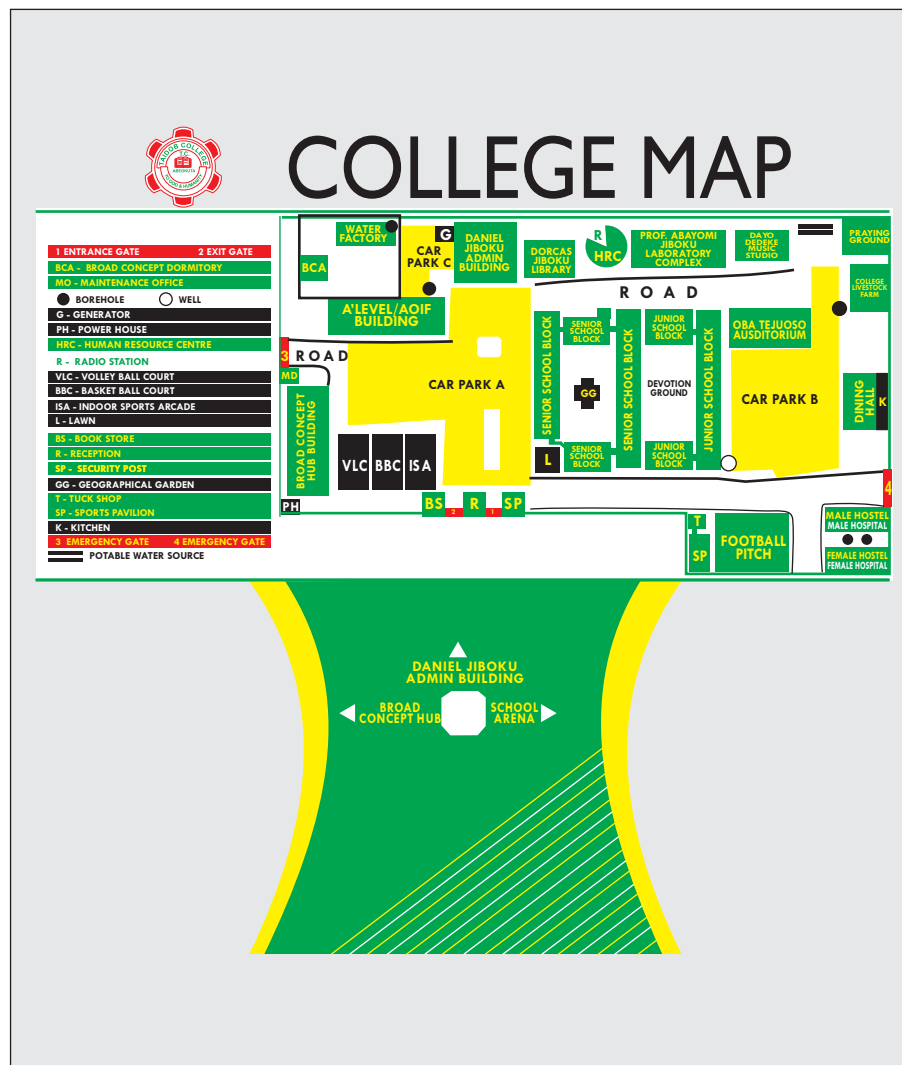

Grade C

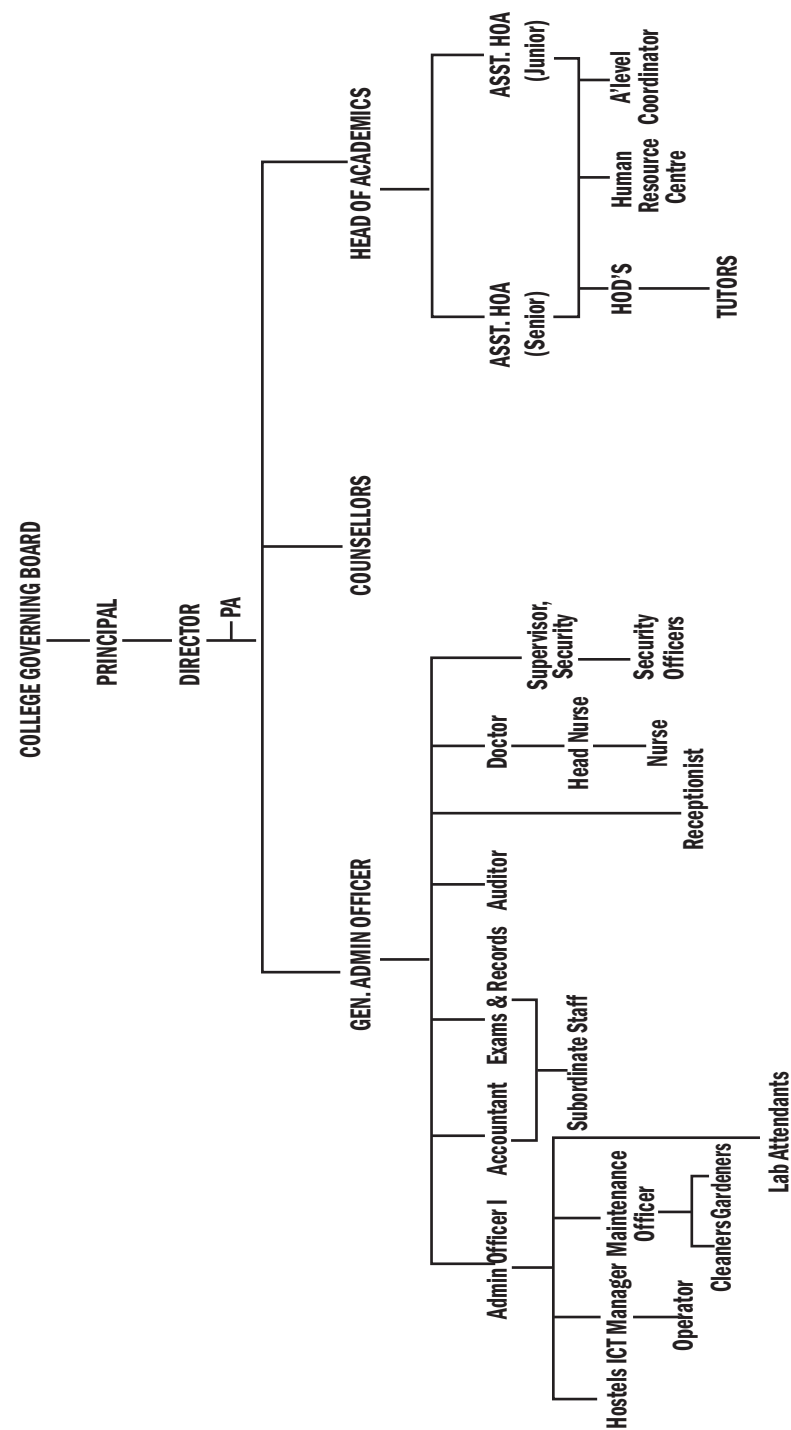
Students in this category shall;

- iv. They will take part in a mandatory remedial programmefor a specified number of weeks with a view to improving their academic performance in the examination.

STUDY HABITS OF HIGHLY EFFECTIVE STUDENTS

The key to becoming an effective student is learning how to study smarter, not harder. This becomes more realistic as you advance in your education. An hour or two of studying a day is usually sufficient to make it through secondary school with satisfactory grades, but on some days there aren't enough hours to do all your studying, hence the need to know how to study smarter.

1. Don't attempt to cram all your studying into one session.

Successful students typically space their work out over shorter periods of time and rarely try to cram all of their studying into just one or two sessions. If you want to become a successful student then you need to learn to be consistent in your studies and to have regular, yet shorter, study periods.

2. Plan when you're going to study.

Successful students schedule specific times throughout the week when they are going to study and then stick to their schedule. Students who study sporadically and whimsically typically do not perform well like students who have a set study schedule. Even if you're all caught up with your studies, creating a weekly routine where you set aside a period of time few days a week to review each of your subjects will ensure you develop habits that will enable you to succeed in your education on the long run.

3. Study at the same time.

Not only is it important that you plan what you're going to study, it's important you create a consistent, daily study routine. When you study at the same time each day and each week, studying will become a regular part of your life. You'll be mentally and emotionally more prepared for each study session and each study session will become more productive. If you have to change your schedule from time to time due to unexpected events, that's okay, but get back on your routine as soon as the event has passed.

4. Each study time should have a specific goal.

Simply studying without direction is not effective. You need to know exactly what you need to accomplish during each study session. Before you start studying, set a study session goal that supports your overall academic goal (i.e. memorize 30 vocabulary words in order to ace the vocabulary section on an upcoming test.)

5. Never procrastinate your planned study session.

It's very easy, and common, to put off your study session because of lack of interest in the subject, because you have other things you need to get done, or just because the assignment is hard. Successful students DO NOT procrastinate studying. If you procrastinate your study session, your studying will become much less effective and you may not get everything accomplished that you need to. Procrastination also leads to rushing, and rushing is the number one cause of errors.

6. Start with the most difficult subject first.

As your most difficult assignment or subject will require the most effort and mental energy, you should start with it first. Once you've completed the most difficult work, it will be much easier to complete the rest of your work. Believe it or not, starting with the most difficult subject will greatly improve the effectiveness of your study sessions, and your academic performance.

7. Always review your notes before starting an assignment.

Obviously, before you can review your notes you must first have notes to review. Always make sure to complete your notes in class and jot. Before you start each study session, and before you start a particular assignment, review your notes thoroughly to make sure you know how to complete the assignment correctly. Reviewing your notes and jottings before each study session will help you remember important subject matter learned during the day, and make sure your studying is targeted and effective.

8. Make sure you're not distracted while you're studying.

Everyone gets distracted by something. Maybe it's the TV. Or maybe it's your family. Or maybe it's just too quiet. Some people actually study better with a little background noise. When you're distracted while studying you (1) lose your train of thought and (2) are unable to focus -- both of which will lead to very ineffective studying. Before you start studying, find a place where you won't be disturbed or distracted.

9. Use study groups effectively.

Ever heard the phrase "two heads are better than one"? Well this can be especially true when it comes to studying. Working in groups enables you to (1) get help from others when you're struggling to understand a concept, (2) complete assignments more quickly, and (3) teach others, whereby helping both the other students and yourself to internalize the subject matter. However, study groups can become very ineffective if they're not structured and if group members come unprepared. Effective students use study groups effectively.

10. Review your notes, schoolwork and other class materials over the weekend.

Successful students review what they've learned during the week over the weekend. This way they're well prepared to continue learning new concepts that build upon previous schoolwork and knowledge acquired the previous week.

We're confident that if you'll develop the habits outlined above, you'll see a major improvement in your academic pursuit.

ACHIEVING ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE THROUGH GOOD STUDY HABIT

Studying and studying productively are two different things. A good student must study to achieve academic success. Continuous studying improves learning and helps to keep vital points fresh in memory. Good methods of study are beneficial while bad habit make study ineffective.

The following are some of the common poor study habits;

1. Lack of study timetable or proper planning
2. Lack of adequate study material e.g. Notes, textbooks, map, etc.
3. Distractions in the study environment e.g. picture, television programme.
4. Bad postures e.g. lying down or standing while studying
5. Poor concentration
7. Inability to identify important points in the study materials.
8. Wrong time schedules
9. Poor jotting and note taking
10. Divided interest and so on.

Guidelines for effective studying

- Develop a convenient study time table and follow it as much as possible.
- Get adequate and relevant learning materials e.g. textbooks, mathematical set, map, writing materials etc.
- Remove things that can distract you from the study room e.g. pictures, T.V programme including your phones, radio, etc.
- Maintain good posture: Preferably you sit straight on a comfortable reading chair and table.
- Concentrate on the study area if there is a need for you to think of something else, leave your study and get that problem solved quickly before setting on again.
- Engage in studying several times and participate in group discussions in order to sharpen your memory.
- Schedule your study time properly
- Make proper jotting while studying and in your various class inclusively.
- Always do your home works and assignments as at when due
- Prepare ahead for test.

PQRST and SQ4R STUDY METHODS

PQRST is an acronym for preview, Question, Read, Summary, and Test.

1. Preview: The student looks at the topic to be learned by glancing over the major heading or the points in the syllabus in order to have a gleaned knowledge of the topic.
2. Question: The student formulates questions to be answered following a thorough examination of the topic(s).
3. Read: The student reads through the related material, focusing on the information that best relates to the question formulated earlier.
4. Summary: The student summarizes the topic in a simple and clear term bringing his or her own understanding into the process. This may include written notes, spider diagrams, flow diagram, labeled diagram, mnemonics, or even voice recordings.
5. Test: The student answers the questions drafted earlier and avoid adding any question that might distract or change the subject in order to determine the level preparedness.

SQ4R STUDY METHOD

SQ4R is an acronym for Survey, Question, Read, Recite, Review, and Reflect.

Following the steps of this method can make your reading more efficient, and help fix the important point of the chapter into your memory.

- **SURVEY:** Look over the chapter. Read the subheadings, picture captions, highlighted vocabulary words, etc.
- **QUESTION:** Turn titles, headings, subheadings into questions. Read chapter or study guide questions.
- **READ:** Answer questions as you read. Slow down when printed materials, notes seem a bit difficult to understand. Re-read important part, etc.
- **RECITE:** Read a section at a time, and then say out loud a few times what has been read. Take notes on important things to remember.
- **RELATE:** Connect information to things you know or meaningful experiences (Video, Science labs, Field trips, real life situations, etc.)
- **REVIEW:** Skim over reading material. Recite and quiz yourself.

In conclusion

Break away from distractions quickly, don't worry if you lose some friends, it will be worth it at the end of the day when the desired result is achieved. You will find friends who have also dared and achieved success; they will be much more valuable to you.

TIPS FOR EXAMINATION SUCCESS

- ❖ Get a copy of the examination time table before time and adhere strictly to it.
- ❖ Get some past question papers and be acquainted with the pattern of questioning.
- ❖ Know the pattern of filling the objective answer sheets.
- ❖ Prepare well for the examination by making use of good study techniques.
- ❖ Set out early enough to arrive at the examination hall at least 1 hour before the scheduled time. This is to avoid unnecessary rush to the examination hall.
- ❖ Assure yourself of success having prepared well for the examination. Do not entertain any fear or thought of failure.
- ❖ Locate your seat and abide by the directives of the invigilator.
- ❖ Fill in all the required information on the answer sheet. It is the first thing you have to do.
- ❖ Read all the instructions on your question paper very carefully and adhere strictly to them.
- ❖ Read all question carefully and understand it before attempting the question.
- ❖ Answer the questions you know very well first before returning to the difficult ones. This will help you save time.
- ❖ Use good, clear and legible handwriting. Avoid unnecessary design and cancellations.
- ❖ Ensure proper numbering of your answers and begin each major answer on a fresh page.
- ❖ Avoid cheating at all cost. Do not depend on others and do not attempt to aid others.
- ❖ Make good use of your time. Divide the time among the questions and work to time.
- ❖ Go through your work and correct all mistakes.
- ❖ Submit your work to time to avoid unnecessary rush and embarrassment.

SCHOOL RULES AND REGULATIONS

CODE OF CONDUCT

The college is a citadel of knowledge where academic excellence and high moral standard is the watchword and utmost priority. Hence, students are to be well-behaved and academically disciplined.

In view of this, the college's code of conduct shall be a guide for the students. Students are to adhere strictly to these rules and regulations both in and outside the college. However, any erring student shall serve the penalty in measure to his / her offence saddled / discharged by the Disciplinary Committee.

The code of conduct are stated under the articles, sections and sub-sections

Article I: General Conduct as Students and Ambassadors

Section:

- i. Students shall always dress neatly and modestly in complete uniform.
- ii. Students shall be polite in addressing others and be courteous at all times.
- iii. Students shall show respect to elders and people around; respect is reciprocal.
- iv. Students shall avoid the use of foul, derogatory or vulgar words. It is highly prohibited.
- v. Do not indulge in any derogatory act.
- vi. Do not hold or be found with any implicating, injurious, suspicious or dangerous items.
- vii. Students shall always be honest.
- viii. Students shall not vandalize any school property.
- ix. Students are expected to be punctual to school/class. Boarding students are expected to have been seated in class by 7:30am while day students are to be seated latest by 7:45am.
- x. Identity cards must be worn by students at all times.
- xi. No student can absent himself/herself from school without genuine reason(s). In case of absenteeism, the student in

- question will be expected to provide written evidence (e.g. doctor's medical report).
- xii. Students are prohibited from being in possession of contraband items i.e. phone, canned food, boiling ring/water heater, non-educative magazine or other printed materials, camera, perfume, etc.
 - xiii. Bullying, lying, stealing and other immoral acts are seriously frowned at.
 - xiv. Class party or celebration of birthdays in school without proper notification and approval of the College Management is prohibited.
 - xv. Once in Taidob school uniform, day students are not allowed to buy edible items on the road while walking to or from the school.
 - xvi. Smoking and drinking is prohibited both within and outside the school.
 - xvii. No student is allowed to operate or have any social media account such as Facebook, Whatsapp, Instagram, Twitter, etc. It is highly prohibited.

Academic conduct of students

Section:

- i. Students are expected to write notes in their handwriting only and notes must be endorsed weekly (remind your teacher in case he/she forgets).
- ii. Under no circumstance should your notes appear rough or tattered. Proper handling of notebooks is advised; Top bond should be used where and when necessary.
- iii. Students must write the following assessments as bonafide members of the college:
 - (a) 1 assignment in Mathematics and Further Mathematics per week
 - (b) At least one assignment fortnightly in other subjects

- (c) 1 class test in all subjects per week
- (d) Periodic test in all subjects every three weeks
- (e) Project/Research assignment given at least once in a term
- (e) For English language, all students must write their essays at least thrice termly
- vii. All assignments must be submitted before 7:45am on your teacher's table the following day except otherwise instructed.
- viii. All class tests, assignments and periodic tests should be written at the back of your notebooks, with students' notebooks turned upside down.
- ix. Under no condition must you tear your notebooks.
- x. You are not to leave your classroom except during break times or when it becomes extremely important.
- xi. A time table is provided in your classroom, use it to bring notebooks of subjects you have to school daily. It is absolutely important to bring all notebooks of subjects you have to school every day.
- xii. Students are to sit upright in the classroom. Sleeping position is not allowed in the classroom.
- xiii. If you must ask questions during classes, your right hand must be raised up.
- xiv. Students are expected to always copy their notes up to date.
- xv. Silence must be maintained in classes always and while filing to the assembly ground.

Article III: Assembly code of behaviour

Section:

- i. Students shall march to and from the assembly ground on a straight file, promptly and smartly.
- ii. You should neither initiate nor participate in talking, or get distracted while coming to or on the assembly

- iii. Students shall maintain a straight line with arm's length distance on the assembly.
- iv. Students shall always participate fully, actively and must be orderly while on the assembly ground.
- v. Students shall report any discomfort or health issue to the nearest teacher, staff or prefect.
- vi. Students shall avoid making undue exclamatory remarks while being addressed on the assembly.
- i. Students shall always be courteous and respectful.
- ii. Each student is expected to come to the assembly with his/her copy of the Songs of Praise.

Article IV: Classroom Code of Behaviour

Section 1:

- i. Students shall always keep their class and books neat and well arranged.
- ii. Students shall keep to their seats / desks. Avoid moving around or sitting on another's desk.
- iii. Students shall dispose their waste properly in the wastebin. Do not litter or wet the floor.
- iv. Loitering is a grievous offence. Always stay in your class **EXCEPT** during break.
- v. Students should always be careful not to damage any class / school property.
- vi. Students shall rise on their feet anytime they are permitted to ask, answer questions or make other contributions during lessons.
- vii. Students are expected to maintain perfect decorum while in class and library.
- viii. Students are expected to tidy up their classrooms, arrange all tables and chairs symmetrically.
- ix. Sleeping in classroom or during prep is not allowed.
- x. Side-talks during lessons are prohibited.

- xi. Ceiling fans must be switched off when students leave the class for other venues or after the close of work.
- xii. No student shall touch the TV remote control or under any circumstance access the TV affixed to the wall in their classroom.

Section 2:

- i. Students shall ensure they write neatly and legibly.
- ii. Students shall keep their notebooks tidy.
- iii. Students shall always listen, concentrate and participate in class activities / lessons.
- iv. Students shall make sure their notes are duly endorsed.
- v. Students shall always do and submit their class tests, assignments and corrections as expected.
- vi. Students shall always come to class with all they need. Avoid borrowing, be self-contained.
- vii. Students shall avoid borrowing or exchange of blade to sharpen their pencil. Instead, a pencil sharpener is recommended for all students.

Article V: Buttery Code of Behaviour

Section 1:

- i. Do not run to the buttry.
- ii. Students shall be on a straight line / file in accordance to arrival. Boys separate and girls separate.
- iii. Students shall greet and be polite during transaction.
- iv. Do not loiter or stand for discussion, get back to your class immediately after purchase.
- v. Students shall disperse from the buttry at the sound of the warning bell. Suspend any further dealings.
- vi. Do not be fraudulent. It is frowned at.

Article VI: Code of Behaviour in any of the Laboratory or school farm

Section 1:

- i. Students shall always obey and abide by all instructions given by the instructor.
- ii. Students shall avoid horse play.
- iii. Students shall not play with any apparatus, tool or implement. It is punishable.
- iv. Students shall always keep equipment tidy and return same in an orderly manner to its place after use.
- v. Students shall not run to or from the laboratory or farm. Just be smart.
- vi. Students shall follow the required dress code that fits into the laboratory or school farm.
- vii. Students shall not take or touch anything from a place unauthorized.

Article VII: Hostel Code of Behaviour

Section 1:

- i. Students shall always keep their rooms, surroundings and personal belongings clean.
- ii. Students should never leave their clothes out on the line overnight after washing.
- iii. Students shall always lay their beds before leaving their rooms.
- iv. Students shall always respect God, His teachings and other people's dignity.
- v. Students should never disrespect their house managers. It is highly punishable.
- vi. Students shall never withhold others' property.
- vii. Students shall always abide by the time rule and be timely.
- viii. Students shall abide by all other rules and instructions given in the hostel.
- ix. Boarding students are not allowed to bring into the hostel, collect or eat any cooked meal other than what is provided by the school. It is a grievous offence.

- x. Scaling of fence within and outside the hostels and school premises is prohibited.
- xi. Students shall adhere strictly to the box room rule.

Article VIII: Bus Terminal Code of Behaviour

Section 1:

- i. Students shall always arrive at the terminal timely (latest 15 minutes before departure).
- ii. Students shall be dressed neatly and modestly arriving at their bus terminal.
- iii. Students shall acknowledge the presence of all those who arrived before them by greeting everyone within and outside the school.
- iv. Students shall maintain a straight line according to their arrival and have boys and girls separately. This also implies that students join the queue at their arrival.
- v. Noise making is highly prohibited, therefore you shall maintain coordinated atmosphere at your terminals.
- vi. Students shall not disrupt or cause disorderliness or move out of the queue once on it.
- vii. Students shall be of good conduct at the terminal (within and outside).
- viii. Students shall board the bus in an orderly manner maintaining the straight line, and respect must be given to sex; girls in first, then the boys.
- ix. Noise making is prohibited in the bus. You must ensure decorum.
- x. Students shall greet the driver or bus coordinator and address him or her with respect.

Article IX: Conduct at Convenience

Section 1:

- i. Students shall shut the door when they move in and out.
- ii. Students shall always use the closet only and never urinate somewhere else in the toilet.

- iii. Students shall always flush the closet after use.
- iv. Students shall always keep the floor of the convenience dry by mopping the floor when they wet / pour water on it.
- v. Students shall not talk or be discussing in the toilet.
- vi. Avoid horse play or any misconduct in the toilet.

Article X: Conduct for Dressing

Section:

- i. Students shall always be on Taidob uniform or (Taidob sportswear on the specified day), any time they are coming to school or representing the school outside the College.
- ii. Students shall in no way add any non-school attire e.g. cardigan, belt, tie, socks, scarf, bandana, etc. to Taidob school uniform.
- iii. Students shall not wear chain, or chain wrist watch or any other wrist bangle or band other than a leather or rubber wrist watch. Also, female students are not allowed to use attachment of any kind for hairdo (**EXCEPT** rubber) while the use of dropping earrings is equally prohibited.
- iv. Neither shall you wear any accessories e.g. rosary, chaplets, rings, etc. that depict any religious or traditional symbol within or outside the College on the uniform or at any representation as an ambassador of the College.
- v. Students shall not be dressed dirty or to show-off their body but rather dress modestly and morally. Don't sag, put on leggings or outfits that are seductive.
- vi. Students shall not be on make-up or use foundation, mascara, eye shadow, lipstick, gloss, nail painting, etc. in the college or when representing her outside.
- vii. Students shall always be on the authorized hair-style or cut (for boys, low-cut is recommended always).
- viii. Students shall in no way transform or amend any of the college outfit. Slim-fitting any of the wears, belting or not knotting your tie and hang it on your neck is prohibited. Unauthorized designs or flashy shoes are not acceptable. You shall put on the complete uniform, knot your tie; use the college belt (for boys), white

socks on only black cover shoes and the college cardigan. Similarly, ankle socks are prohibited.

- ix. Students shall seek permission from the authority beforehand, if for any reason they might not be on the corporate complete authorized outfit.
- x. Students are expected to be well dressed, wear complete uniform with tie, as indecent dressing will not be tolerated.

Article XI: Interpersonal Code of Relationship

Section 1: Student, teachers and staff relationship

- i. Students shall always approach and address teachers or staff politely and without any gesture of insults.
- ii. Students shall always respect all staff of the college.
- iii. Students shall never disrespect any staff for no reason when being addressed.
- iv. Students shall always pave way for the staff (Elders) at any point / spot of contact.
- v. Students shall acknowledge and greet the staff when you see them either within or outside the college. Polite and cultured pleasantries only are allowed.
- vi. Students shall have no other affairs with any staff outside academics within and outside the college.
- vii. Students shall not touch or take the teacher's material, property or play around his her table.
- viii. Students are not allowed to give items as gifts to teachers (Cash or other materials) without the management's approval.
- ix. Only class captains or subject representatives are allowed to visit staff rooms and this has to be in the morning before devotion or during break.
- x. Students are not allowed to contact their parents through any member of staff. It is highly prohibited.

Section 2: Student-to-Student Relationship

- i. Students shall respect and address one another politely on any issue. If insulted, report to the nearest authority (teacher).
- ii. Students shall never engage in fight or physical combat or exchange unpleasant words, within or outside the college.
- iii. Students shall not threaten or intimidate others in words or actions.
- iv. Students shall not participate, collaborate or support any illicit, immoral, unfair, inhuman, or ungodly activities within or outside the college. Immoral acts include:
 - (a) Writing or receiving love letters
 - (b) Exchange of gifts (greeting cards, flowers, frames, jewelry pieces, etc.)
 - © Touching of sensitive parts of an opposite or same gender. The idea of homosexuality, lesbianism, dating and any other unwarranted show of feelings are highly prohibited.
 - (d) Being in an isolated area, in compromising position, etc.
 - (e) Asking for requited love in words, actions or gestures from an opposite gender.
- v. Students shall not have other relationships with any student aside academic affairs.
- vi. Students shall always respect their seniors within and outside the college.
- vii. Students shall always respect their seniors and never call them by name but as "Senior".....
- viii. Students shall always be truthful to each other. Never lie or steal. Be Honest!

Section 3: OPERATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR PARENTS

- i. Parents shall notify the school authority if their ward will be absent for any reason.
- ii. Parents shall only communicate with their wards once they are within the college via the authorities and as such, students should not be given phones to school.

- iii. Parents shall perform their obligations financially to the College promptly.
- iv. Parents shall accord due respect to the teachers and staff of the College once recognized.
- v. Parents shall not encourage / stimulate their wards to violate / disregard any of the codes of conduct or rules of the College.
- vi. Parents shall not engage in a public display (shouting, harassing or any other form of assault on staff) of themselves within and outside the College.
- vii. Parents shall not bring any edible item to the school except during the beginning of the term, visiting day and the mid-term break.
- viii. Parents shall be informed of their ward(s) sickness after two days only if there is no improvement in the health status of such student(s). The college management frowns at arbitrary request for pick-up of ward on health grounds as the college resident Doctor will always give directive in this regard.
- ix. Parents shall not bring cooked food item(s) for their wards on visiting days.
- x. Parents shall not make an arbitrary request for the release of their ward(s) while the school is in session EXCEPT if such request is based on health ground or academic need which must be formally backed up by necessary documents.
- xi. Parents shall ensure they return their ward(s) on the resumption dates specified in the report sheet, newsletter, text message or as announced on the assembly ground after every holiday or mid-term break.

- xii. Parents shall not unnecessarily interact with any member of staff EXCEPT during visiting days.
- xiii. Parents shall agree to the modest application of the cane on their ward(s) as one of the modes of correction for any act of misdemeanor committed.
- xiv. Parents are permitted to visit their children only on visiting days as arbitrary visit would not be entertained.
- xv. In event of obtaining an approved exeat from the College, Parents are to ensure that such student return on the date and time stipulated on the exeat note strictly.
- xvi. Parents shall route any form of gratis through the college's Administrative officer.
- Xvii. Parents shall not publish, create group(s) or post any uncensored or unauthorized piece of information that is related to their children vis-à-vis the school on any social media handle or the print media.

TAIDOB COLLEGE STUDENTS' RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. PREAMBLE

Taidob College is an institution of learning which is driven to raise persons who are worthy both in learning and character and see to the development of students' general well-being and that of the society. In line with this purpose, the duty lies on the School Management to protect the quality of the atmosphere. The College has certain definitive values, among which are respect to authority, individual and communal safety, dignity of all staff and students within the college.

2. This Students' Rules and Regulations is intended to present a clear statement of students' rights and responsibilities as established by the Board of Directors; thus establishing the types of acts that are not acceptable in the Taidob College community.

3. DEFINITIONS

- ✓ **Class representative:** Oversees the affairs of students in the class
- ✓ **Classroom:** A place of learning including but not limited to visual learning, e-learning, skills acquisition centre and any other place where knowledge is being imparted into students.
- ✓ **Hostel:** Residence of students who are boarded by the school.
- ✓ **Legal Counsel:** This shall be a representative of firm of legal Practitioners approached by the school to ensure the compliance with existing laws of the land.
- ✓ **Lights out:** Such time designated to be the last time within which the students are to be in their beds after the activities of a day.
- ✓ **Prefect:** A student representative appointed to

oversee the affairs of the students in an area.

- ✓ **School:** Shall refer where appropriate to Taidob College, Asero Estate, Abeokuta, Ogun State, and Broad Concept International and Entrepreneurship Hub of Taidob College, Asero, Abeokuta.
- ✓ **Staff:** Include all employees, teaching and non-teaching, hostel managers, hospital and admin serving as such in the school.
- ✓ **Student(s):** All Students (Regular and Boarding) and learners of Taidob College and its subsidiary, Broad Concept International and Entrepreneurship Hub
- ✓ **Subject representative:** Oversees the affairs of students in a subject.
- ✓ **“May”** is used in the permissive sense.
- ✓ **“Shall”** and **“will”** are used in the imperative sense.

4. APPLICATION AND SCOPE OF AUTHORITY

These Rules shall primarily apply within the premises known as TAIDOB COLLEGE and sparingly shall be in effect where appropriate for the duration where a student is regarded as a ward of the School including all such activities and places where School permitted or sponsored events take place or where the students are to be seen as ambassadors of the School.

1. DISCIPLINARY MATTERS

A. Rights and duties of Participants to a Disciplinary Hearing

At any Disciplinary hearing, the participants varyingly may include the student(s) charged, a complainant, witnesses, support person, parent(s) or guardian(s) and the members of the Disciplinary Committee.

Generally, the Complainant, the alleged victim where available and the student(s) charged shall each have the right to:

- Be notified of all charges
- Review any written reports submitted in support of the charge(s)
- Be informed of the hearing process
- Be present at all stages of the hearing process except where such would affect attendance in examinations and tests.
- Submit a personal statement in writing in respect to the charge so made.
- Be informed of the conclusion of the Committee as well as the sanctions imposed.

In addition to the above, the student charged with violation of these rules shall have the right to:

- I. Be notified of the information available against him/her before sitting commences.
- II. Request an alternate hearing panel member when there is reasonable cause to believe that the hearing panel as constituted will be unable to conduct an impartial hearing. (This is to be done by making such request in writing, addressed to the Director, and stating the name of the panel member concerned as well as concrete reason(s) why such is to be excluded).
- III. Be presumed not to be in 'violation' of the Rules and Regulations until the facts presented at the hearing prove otherwise.
- IV. Present defence and testimony in any way appropriate within a single sitting, including presenting proof of character witness(s) if appropriate.
- V. Receive a written notice of sanction(s) imposed.

B. DISCIPLINARY PROCEDURES

- i. All disciplinary actions must be reported within 7 days of the knowledge of the alleged offence.
- ii. Knowledge of offence may be either by petition from staff or student, parent or direct apprehension and referral by someone in authority.
- iii. Where the Director determines that the alleged conduct may violate provisions of this Rules and Regulations, he shall, within 5 working days of such determination inform the Student(s) concerned of the commencement of an investigation into such allegation.
- iv. The investigation shall be conducted by the Director and/or his designee(s) and may include but not be limited to interviews with witnesses, the complainant(s) and review of any pertinent material and information. The student(s) Charged shall also be interviewed

here. These investigations must be completed within a period 14 days. A record of all investigations MUST, always be maintained and where through designees of the Director, regular updates must be submitted to the office of the Director in respect of this matter.

- v. Where other charges arise during or after the commencement of a current investigation, the 14 days shall begin to count after the last alleged charge comes to light.
- vi. At the conclusion of the investigation, the Director will:
 - (a) determine if there is insufficient basis in fact and dismiss the matter or
 - (b) decide that there is a sufficient basis for discipline and proceed with such.
- vii. Where the Director decides to proceed with discipline, he shall fix a date and time within 10 working days, inform all necessary persons as stated in 7A and ensure arrangements are made towards proper record keeping of the whole hearing proceedings.

C. GUIDELINES AT HEARINGS

- i. All hearings must be conducted in private.
- ii. All hearings shall be headed by a Chair (man or woman) appointed by the School Management who may be any of the following: the Principal, the Director, Members of the Board of Directors, Heads of Departments or Administrative Staff.
- iii. The hearing shall also have a Secretary whose primary role shall be to take all records of the hearing and prepare hard and soft copies of these records for use by the Management.
- iv. Other members of the Disciplinary Committee shall either be determined per case basis or from the standing disciplinary committee of the school. Where a special committee is needed for a

- particular matter, the pool of members shall be from those in (ii) and (iii) above as well as approved members of the Parents Forum, the Legal Counsel and any other specialized contractor with the school who can give an input into the matter to be resolved.
- v. Where a petition has been received against the fitness of any member of the panel to sit in a matter, the Director shall investigate such allegations and take appropriate steps to ensure sanctity in the School.
 - vi. Admission or non-admission of anyone into the hearing room shall be at the discretion of the Chair of the hearing body. The Chair shall also have the authority to discharge or to remove any person whose presence is deemed unnecessary or obstructive to the proceedings.
 - vii. Except as directed by the Chair, support persons shall limit their role in a hearing to that of a consultant to the charged student(s).
 - viii. The Student(s) charged shall be responsible for presenting their witnesses and any additional information regarding the matter.
 - ix. The hearing panel may question witness presented by the student(s) charged as well as all others involved or witnesses in the matter including any other person who the chair may decide to call in respect of the matter.
 - x. The Chair may device any additional procedural guidelines as he/she deems fit depending on the circumstances of each case.
 - xi. Where the hearing panel finds that the student violates these Rules and Regulations:
2. All Punishments for erring students shall be attended to using the prescribed sanctions and same may be varied only at the instance of the Board of Directors.

NOTE

- a. **The school shall not be vicariously liable for any act or acts wittingly or unwittingly perpetrated by any student which runs foul of the laws of Nigeria.**
- b. Students who come late to school 3 times within a term will be given 12 strokes of cane while the parent(s) or guardian(s) will be invited to write a letter of undertaking.
- c. 3 minor offences within a term will be regarded as a major offence and will attract suspension or expulsion.
- d. 2 major offences within a term will be regarded as a grievous offence and attract suspension from the school or expulsion.
- e. Grievous offences that carry suspension as punishment, when repeated within the session will attract expulsion.
- f. Prefects caught breaking rules under categories B and C are to be stripped of their Prefectship and punished appropriately but reprimanded under category A.
- g. In cases of expulsion, the principal/director will not allow calls, text messages or honour having any physical contact with the parents of the expelled student.
- h. **In conclusion, kindly note that there is no perfect law anywhere. Law is organic; it is subject to amendments in view of new developments in the school and the society at large.**
